"WELCOME"

The Parish of Saint John welcomes the members of the **United Empire Loyalist (UEL) New Brunswick** Branch to Trinity Church this morning.

We are pleased, as the Loyalist Parish, to join together with the UEL not only to celebrate our collective rich heritage as being descendants, either direct or indirect (parishioners) of our forefathers who sacrificed everything to commence a new life, continuing their love for British leadership but also to be witnesses of the continued love of God, our Loyalist planted here in Saint John upon their arrival in 1783.

The United Empire Loyalist Story

During the American war of Independence against British rule approximately one third of the population of the Thirteen Colonies opposed the Revolution. The people were known as United Empire Loyalists.

The Loyalists suffered great persecution and the confiscation of their properties as they refused to take the oath of allegiance to the States, preferring to remain loyal to the British Crown.

The British Government offered compensation for their losses and land grants in what are now Nova Scotia, new Brunswick, Quebec and Ontario. It is estimated that 40,000 to 50,000 Loyalists emigrated to Canada.

The Loyalists were Canada's first refugees. These followers of the Crown came from every walk of life and represented all classes of society, including the clergy, royal office holders, farmers, seamen, professional men, landowners, merchants, fishermen, tradesmen, industrial servants and slaves.

Although they were branded as traitors by the rebels most were intellectually and morally good men and their principals were respectful.

The Loyalists were not all of British ancestry but included Irish, Scottish, Welsh, French Huguenots with many possessing Western European lineage, including Germany, the Netherlands and others.

On May 18th, 1783, thousands of Loyalists disembarked their ships at Saint John, New Brunswick, who literally found a city overnight. One year later the Province of New Brunswick was established, separating from Nova Scotia. Two years later on May 18th, 1785, Saint John became Canada's first incorporated city.

I thank you for your prayers as I step out of the familiar and put my trust in God to guide, comfort and be my constant companion as I join the pilgrims this year. May we experience a spiritual renewal in our lives that will be ever present and be a guide to our future.
