In Loving Memory of Mrs. Evelyn P. Logan ORC (1925-1998) From the Family

The Flowers on the Altar this Sunday are placed by the Logan Family in loving memory of Mrs. Evelyn P. Logan ORC who was born 100 years ago on 9 April 1925.

Our Mother was born into the Baptist faith but became an Anglican when she married Rodman E. Logan in 1948. She attended St Jude's Church in West Saint John where she was active in the Guilds and taught Sunday School for several years. In the mid-1970s the family began attending Trinity, perhaps because she was taking organ lessons from Trinity's organist Ruth Clark at the time. She was active at Trinity, again with the Guilds and as a member of Vestry for a period. When she and her husband retired to Westfield they became equally active parishioners at St. James Parish. In addition to her contributions to her Church, she was a tireless volunteer with community groups including IODE, University Women, Children's Aid, Home and School at both Beaconsfield and Saint John High School, in most of which she assumed leadership positions. By far her greatest passion was the Canadian Red Cross. She began volunteering with the Red Cross as a school girl in Woodstock in the 1930s and never stopped. She held several executive positions locally, was President of the New Brunswick Branch of the Red Cross and continued afterwards as National Chair of Assistance International and Domestic, an important committee of the Society. She was recognized by both the Red Cross in being awarded the Order of the Red Cross and by the Government of Canada with the Canada Volunteer Medal. Taken from her family much too soon, she is lovingly remembered by the family on this 100th anniversary of her birth.
